Summation of Hizb ut-Tahrir's STATE DEPARTMENTS By Bo Perrin

The Caliphate state department is composed of administrations, directorates and departments. (Article 95) The state department's policy is supposedly built upon the system's efficiency, speed in implementation and competence of those in charge. (Article 96) Usually, policy is the principle that underlies the actions needed to solve problems rather than something built upon efficiency, speed or competence.

According to HuT Shari' ah allows a male or female or Muslim or non-Muslim to fill a position in the state department. (Article 97) The only real quality a person needs to fill a position is to be suitably competent for that position. A special director is appointed over every directorate and a general manager must be appointed over each administration. (Article 98) The Constitution states that all directors are responsible before the general manager of their admin, directorate and department. Then the Article states that "they" are responsible to the Caliph, waali and 'aamil. The issue is whether the term "they" refer to the directors or the general manager.

The managers and directors can only be dismissed for administrative reasons. (Article 99) The general manager is authorized to dismiss, appoint, transfer, suspend or discipline as he sees fit. The general manager within the admin., directorate or department is authorized to appoint, transfer, suspend, question, discipline or dismiss employees within that admin., directorate or department. (Article 100)
